#### The Person of Jesus

#### **Death Dismissed**

"Once we have grasped our situation in God's full world, the startling disregard Jesus and the apostles had of death, it all makes sense. Paul bluntly states that Jesus abolished death – he simply did away with it."

#### 2 Timothy 1:10-11

But has now been revealed by the appearing of our Savior Jesus Christ, who has abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. NKJV

#### **Death Dismissed**

"To one group of his day who believed physical death was the cessation of one's existence he said 'God is not the God of the dead, but of the living' (Luke 20:38). His meaning was that those who love and are loved by God are not allowed to cease to exist for they are God's treasures." Dallas Williard
