- Psalm 116:13 <u>I will lift</u> up the cup of salvation and praise the Lord's name for saving me.
- Psalm 116:14 <u>I will keep</u> my promises to the Lord in the presence of all his people.
- Psalm 116: 17 <u>I will offer</u> you a sacrifice of thanksgiving and call on the name of the Lord.
- Psalm 116:18 / will fulfill my vows to the Lord in the presence of all his people

Thankfulness

- When David ponders as to how he can show his gratitude to God, he says something striking.
- He decides the best offering he can present is an empty cup that needs to be filled again.
- His act of thankfulness will be to take in more of the goodness of God and more of the inputs of God like he has already received.

- He says in effect, "Lord you have done so much for me that I want to show the world that your goodness has not run out".
- Fill my cup again so that everyone knows that you Lord, have a never-ending supply of mercy and grace for your people.
- May everyone know that You have all that we need both now and forever.
